Under the Fundraising pillar, we launched the Japan Earthquake Donation Drive, in partnership with AEON Credit Service and AEON CO. (M) BHD., raising RM500,000 for those affected by the earthquake in Suzu, Japan.

We also successfully raised RM1 million through AEON Charity Run 2024 held at Putrajaya in conjunction with MAF 20th Anniversary. The event saw the enthusiastic participation of over 2,000 runners across the 5km and 10km categories.

Under our Education pillar, we continued our Smart Classroom initiative, training teachers tech-integrated teaching methods and hosting a three-day Digital Student Green Challenge that to nurture students' digital literacy while deepening understanding on sustainability and environment.

Through the Community Support pillar, we empowered B40 individuals via KAMI Project by providing vocational training to equip them with confidence and qualifications to secure better future. Our AEON KASiH programme helped ease the burden of medical costs for those in need. Funds were channelled to 10 selected hospitals, providing access to quality treatment to patients.



We also continued our quiet but meaningful efforts through general donations, offering support to individuals facing personal hardships across the country.

# Japan Donation Drive



In early 2024, the MAF, in collaboration with AEON Credit Service (M) Berhad (ACS) and AEON CO. (M) BHD. (AEON), launched the Japan Earthquake Donation Drive to support victims of the 7.6-magnitude earthquake that struck Suzu on the Noto Peninsula of Ishikawa Prefecture, Japan, in January 2024.

The campaign successfully raised RM500,000, with AEON and ACS contributing RM175,000, MAF donating RM150,000, and the remaining amount collected from individuals, stakeholders, and customers. Donations were gathered through loose coin boxes placed at AEON Stores and AEON Malls nationwide, as well as via the MAF website, the Touch 'n Go platform, and QR codes.

On March 15, 2024, the donation was officially presented to His Excellency Takahashi Katsuhiko, the Ambassador of Japan, at the Japanese Embassy in Kuala Lumpur. Datuk Iskandar Sarudin, President of MAF, and Mr Ng Eng Kiat, Chairman of ACS, led the presentation, reaffirming AEON Group's commitment to supporting those affected by natural disasters.

This initiative underscores the strong bond between Malaysia and Japan and highlights the collective effort to provide relief and support to communities in need.









# **AEON Charity Run 2024**

MAF successfully organised AEON Charity Run 2024 to raise fund for AEON KASiH programme. The event, held on 28 July 2024 at Anjung Floria, Putrajaya, was part of MAF's 20th anniversary celebration.

President of MAF, Datuk Iskandar Sarudin flagged off more than 2,000 runners taking part in the 5km and 10km categories. Datuk Iskandar expressed his appreciation to participants as the event is more than just a run. The proceeds from the event were channelled to assist patients in need of medical assistance and care through AEON KASiH programme.

Also present was Youth and Sports Minister, YB Hannah Yeoh, who presented the mock cheque to representatives from the Ministry of Health.

# TEACHERS WORKSHOP



Held in July 2024 at Melia Hotel Kuala Lumpur, the Smart Classroom Teachers' Workshop – Phase 2 gathered 23 teachers from 12 schools across Malaysia. The workshop equipped educators with practical tools and strategies to integrate technology into classrooms, fostering engaging and innovative learning experiences.









Educator Support: Helping teachers implement Smart Classroom strategies effectively.

Professional Network: Building a collaborative learning community to drive digital education.

Survey results showed a significant impact, with 23 participants (in-person & online) and an estimated 600 teachers benefiting from shared knowledge. Additionally, 40%-50% of respondents reported enhanced use of Smart Classroom technology in their teaching.



















# Students' Engagement 2024

The Digital Student Green Challenge, a dynamic three-day camp designed to empower students with digital skills and environmental awareness, was held in December 2021, in collaboration with consultant.

This initiative provided a platform for students to engage in interactive learning experiences, fostering a deeper understanding of sustainability in the digital age. The programme successfully concluded the year, leaving participants inspired and empowered with digital tools and problem-solving skills to drive innovative solutions.

Impact Survey Results reported a 90% overall positive experience by students who participated in the program and adopted a growth mindset, self-efficacy, and interpersonal skills.

















The KAMI Suai kenal orientation, held in collaboration with People System Consultancy, welcomed 50 participants eager to enhance their business and financial knowledge.



This program focused on SWOT Analysis and Customer-Focused Branding, equipping participants with essential insights for entrepreneurship and employment. More than just a learning experience, the initiative aims to empower individuals with confidence, technical expertise, and the mindset needed to thrive in their careers.

As part of this effort, 30 selected participants will advance to GIATMARA training, where they will gain hands-on skills and earn the Sijil Kemahiran Malaysia (Certificate of Competency) - a vital step toward business ownership and sustainable employment.

This initiative aligns with the government's vision of fostering entrepreneurship and job creation, ensuring participants have the tools to become future-ready leaders in the economy.

The average income for 31 participants shows an increase of 221.8%, and the increase in knowledge shows a significant impact of 171.10% before and after the program.
